Article of the Week



We are at present undergoing an intensive phase of discussion with regard to the new Library facility we plan to build during 2011 and in the early part of 2012. Much of this discussion revolves around the styles of learning which are likely to develop within this new Library facility. The building will need to be inviting, exciting, stimulating and flexible so that it can respond to the changes in learning that are likely to occur in the decades ahead.

Our Senior Teacher Librarian, Mrs Geri Coughlin, and Senior Curriculum Staff continue to wrestle with an understanding of the ways in which information will be accessible to our boys in future years. Print v Digital: how will this develop and what fascinating avenues will boys utilise to gather and test information?

Recently I read an article about what the word "reading" will mean in a modern context. The emergence of the web has turned our traditional vision of a book on its head. And within this, the role of the author has significantly moved from a "fountain of knowledge" to a "facilitator of a conversation". As this facilitator, he or she engages the readers in the material being presented at a higher level, by offering an opportunity for dialogue, conversation and response in relation to the text. The key word is conversation; and suddenly there is a dynamic network of authors and readers, in which the authors can be seen as leaders of a community of inquiry.

I recommend the article to which I refer as essential reading for everyone. It sets the scene for a new age of research information development, interactive understanding, comment and debate. "Myer-Briggs" Workshop offered to Year 11

- Our Year 11 students at Trinity are preparing for the senior leadership functions which they take up once our Year 12 students finish.
- One step in this handover-takeover is a voluntary evening workshop led by Mr. Tom Delahunty.
- He will introduce the Year 11 boys to the "Myer-Briggs Type Indicator": an instrument which is widely used in industry and commerce.
- Apart from having the particular qualifications which licence him to conduct MBTI workshops, Mr Delahunty has extensive experience in facilitating groups and involving people in practical exercises.
- He will discuss some limitations of this Indicator and introduce participants to some ways they can apply it while working in self-organising groups (VCE Study Groups or House Activities are two obvious examples), when developing study strategies or when examining their career interests.
- The workshop is being repeated on a choice of two different evenings: *Monday, 17 August or Tuesday, 18 August.*
- Applications need to be placed into the box outside Mr Mansour's Office BEFORE the end of Monday, August 10. This allows time during the week prior to the workshops for Year 11 boys to complete a pencil and paper self-assessment (which they retain and bring with them to the workshop).

From the Junior School



"To accomplish great things, we must not only act, but also dream; not only plan, but also believe." Anatole France 1980.

Most of the younger teachers in Junior School smile - perhaps I'll use the word smirk - when I mention 1980. They weren't born in 1980, or they were infants and can't recall those times.



I was only young then - merely a boy of 12 years old. It was the year I was first involved in a musical at school. I held the glorious role of chorus member (with the walk on cameo as a bookseller) in the production of Lionel Bard's '*Oliver!*' Even after the eon of time that has passed, I can still sing the tunes, remember the choreography, entrances, exits and the now immemorial line that I had to recite on stage. Not bad for an old man.

This musical was the first of many that I was involved in. I was on stage and acting while a student, but have never found the courage to walk the boards as an adult. Instead I involved myself at different schools in the capacity of sometime producer, sometime director, sometime janitor and most times jack of all trades. From that one first experience in 1980, came a want to be involved in musical theatre.

In 2009, the Junior School musical will be '*Aladdin Jr*' - an adaptation of the Disney story from 1001 Arabian nights. All students from Prep to Year Six will be involved in the performances which will be performed at the Eldon Hogan Performance Theatre at Xavier College on the 1, 2 and 3 of September. Last Wednesday I had the good fortune to speak at the Classroom Representatives luncheon in the East room where I requested assistance from parents to assist with various areas of the production. We already have all Junior School staff involved in the production, but it's not nearly enough, given we will have all 360 students on stage at one time or another. Having parents involved in the production is vital for the success of the show.

I've often described this stage of a production as 'the quickening'. Auditions and rehearsals started as relaxed and full of hope early in Term Two, only to speed up and have greater urgency a couple of weeks ago. There is still much to organise from sets, props, programs, ticketing, costumes, costumes and more costumes. Already we have had terrific support from our parents in the Junior School. I cannot continue without mentioning the work of Sue Guinane and Bidy Van Aanholt, who have been instrumental in organising the costumes for the production - last count there were 225 costumes to make, find or hire in total.

This brings me to an important question. Why go to all this trouble to put on a performance that only lasts a couple of nights? A production that places an enormous amount of stress on everyone involved and stretches a slim budget? I can recall 1980. Back then, I was given an opportunity from dedicated staff and parents to have an experience of a lifetime, a chance to develop skills of performance, oration and teamwork; to have an involvement in an important aspect of our culture.

When I look out onto the stage in a few weeks time and see those shining faces on our boys as they bow to the accolades of an appreciative audience, I will ask myself if all the effort was worth it. I think you know my answer.

A single login will allow parents to choose interview times for both Trinity and Ruyton classes. Please note that the booking system will not become active until Sunday 2 August at 6:00 pm.

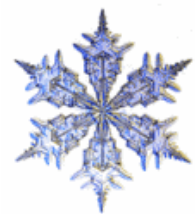
